Getting Started - An introduction to careers in the health professions

Key Stage 3 Curriculum Objectives

The tasteofmedicine.com website can be used to cover many learning objectives from different Key Stage 3 curriculum subjects using differently structured lessons. This lesson plan is focussed on the *Getting Started* section of the website and covers the following objectives.

Citizenship

- Students are able to interpret different media and ICT both as sources of information and as a means of communicating ideas.

PSHE – Personal Wellbeing

- Students are able to reflect on personal strengths, achievements and areas for development.
- Students are able to make real choices and decisions based on accurate information obtained through their own research using a range of sources, including the internet, other media sources and visits/visitors to and from the wider community.
- Students are able to evaluate their own personal development and learning, set realistic targets and goals for future life choices and develop strategies for meeting them.

PSHE – Economic wellbeing and financial capability

- Students are able to understand that everyone has a career.
- Students develop a sense of personal identity for career progression.
- Students are able to use a variety of information sources to explore options and choices in career and financial contexts.
- Students are able to take action to improve their chances in their career
- Students are able to have contact with information, advice and guidance specialists.

Science

- Students can prepare to specialise in a range of science subjects at key stage 4 and consider career opportunities both within science and in other areas that are provided by science qualifications.

Could a career in healthcare be right for you?

Resources required:

Computer with a projector, big screen and audio or interactive whiteboard set up with internet access and audio. Students will also need access to individual computers.

(NB: If there is only one computer available we suggest you modify the assembly session plan available rather than using this particular plan)

Note: To view the website the following software and updates are required:

- Adobe Flash Player Version 8 or above
- Adobe Acrobat Reader to open documents in PDF format

Provide a printout of the accompanying worksheet for each student in the class.

Lesson Objectives:

- Introduce the tasteofmedicine.com website.
- Encourage students to move into higher education.
- Have an appreciation of healthcare careers in the National Health Service (NHS).
- Challenge the stereotypical views of healthcare university courses and careers.

Introduction: (8 mins)

- This website I'm about to show you is all about healthcare and covers subjects like:-
 - Why you might like to study for a career in health.
 - The huge variety of jobs in healthcare
 - What being at university and the jobs themselves are like.
- It was made by St George's, University of London.
- It is important to understand about careers before you choose your options for Y10 and Y11.
- It's a fun interactive website that you can access online at any time. It also offers advice on where to go next if you think a career in healthcare might be something you would want to do and also where to find more information.

Before getting on to the website itself hand out the worksheets and ask the class:

- Has anyone here thought about/ considered a career in healthcare?
- When I say you could have a career in healthcare, how many different jobs do you think there are?

In pairs get the students to come up with as many different healthcare related jobs as they can in 2 minutes. They can write their answers on the worksheet provided.

Supervised independent work (20 mins)

1) Getting started

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- Get the group to work through the website to find the answers to the questions on the worksheet.
- Once they have completed the worksheet they can go to the games section of the website.

- Let the students know that medical emergency interactive questions can appear at any time. Like a real emergency, students should go through them before they move on.

Closing (7 mins)

Ask the class as a whole if they have any questions

Ask them what they've learnt...did anything surprise them?

Has it changed their opinion about anything?- I.e. studying for a career in healthcare, or how obtainable it is.

Highlight the *Where Do I Start* section, if they want more advice/ information.

If students have any questions there is a 'contact us' section on the website - students should be encouraged to do this if they have any questions.
